



## Funding Source List: 2012 Grant Cycle 1 (Spring)

The Community Foundation of the New River Valley (CFNRV) is pleased to announce the opportunity for approximately \$30,000 in grants for the Spring of 2012.

A typical grant award ranges from \$500 to \$2,000.

The CFNRV awards grants from its component funds. Funds eligible to distribute in the Spring 2012 cycle are listed below. However, this does not guarantee that these funds will distribute grants.

**The Ghia Borg Memorial Fund:** Supports general charitable purposes.

**The Ghia Borg Memorial Health Care Fund:** Supports health care needs of the poor, the needy and less fortunate, and for general charitable purposes.

**Cabell Brand and Shirley Brand Student Fellowship and Mini-Grant Fund:** Supports fellowships to encourage and facilitate the study, research and development of solutions to social and environmental issues.

**The Jackson S. Copenhaver Fund:** Supports general charitable purposes.

**Diana, Princess of Wales Memorial Fund:** Supports NRV public charities that assist AIDS victims and their families, children in need, those in need of hospice care and/or the homeless.

**Early Childhood Education Teachers Fund:** Supports the professional development and continued strengthening of New River Valley early childhood education teachers.
